I. The following submittal questions have been addressed:

1. What if we encounter unsuitable soils?

The majority of the trail is on grade and there is a net fill amount (see #16 below). A line item for “Borrow Excavation” has been added in Additional Items to the bid schedule should contractor encounter unsuitable soils. This item includes the removal and disposal of unsuitable material and placement of imported borrow as necessary.

2. Is the contractor to apply for the NPS permit?

The contractor is required to apply for a National Park Service Special Use Permit. It is a short form and there is a \$50.00 fee. See sample permit enclosed.

3. Are there any site furnishings such as benches, trash bins, etc. to be included in our bid?

No.

4. Will there be a separate insurance policy required to work near the Railway system or will the standard minimum requirements be sufficient?

The insurance requirements shown amended in special conditions reference the Railway requirements. Contractor should reference Norfolk Southern Special Provisions for the Protection of Railway Interests for additional insurance requirement.

5. Do the quantities given on the “detailed estimate” account for the scope items with the phrase “additional not shown on plans?”

The “additional not shown on plans” quantities are also listed in the detailed estimate. The purpose of these is to have a quantity for specific items that may require additional amounts during construction. We may need the quantity (or more) and we also may not need it at all. All items shown on the erosion control plans are to be included in the Lump Sum payment item for Temporary Soil Erosion Control.

6. Will the erosion control monitoring be done by the owner/engineer?

Erosion control monitoring has been added to the bid schedule in the updated proposal section. As such, this will be provided by the contractor.

7. Is there a potential start date for the project?

Start date will be determined by the owner at the preconstruction meeting.

8. Is there a way to access the site from anyplace other than Martin Luther King Jr Blvd near the project starting point?

No.

9. Are pickup trucks allowed to cross the bridge after it's in place?

No.

10. Where is the existing canopy?

The existing canopy is located on the south side of the Ocmulgee River at the existing Ocmulgee Heritage Trail and Railroad crossing.

11. How many flaggers are needed if we have to use them near the railroad?

Reference Norfolk Southern Special Provisions for the Protection of Railway Interests in the project specific special provisions section. "Normally the Railway will assign one flagman to a project, but in some cases, more than one may be necessary..."

12. Does the privet hedge need to be removed to the to the river's edge or are we working inside the delineated limits of disturbance only?

Yes. The 12 Acres of privet removal includes the project limits and the area to the river's edge.

13. Does underbrush that is not privet need to remain?

Underbrush should be cleared within the project limits.

14. Is the permanent grassing only inside the limits of disturbance?

Yes.

15. Can we use the Macon Water Authority's creek crossing to get the equipment and concrete trucks across the creek?

Yes.

16. Do you have any cut/fill calculations for the project?

Yes, see below.

Cut = 399 CY ----- Fill = 1,959 CY

17. Is the price of \$9,585 for the railroad permit dated 2014 still the current price?

This is not a permit fee; it is the force account estimate. Refer to the Special Conditions and Norfolk Southern Special Provisions for the Protection of Railway Interests. We believe that this estimate is still appropriate.

18. Does the Ocre Color additive go in the canopy rolling slab, tie down slab, and the bridge concrete?

The color additive goes in all concrete trail sections. This item has been listed as a Deductive Alternative should the owner decide not to use.

II. The following items have been revised or added to the contract documents and specifications:

1. Proposal – Delete the Proposal Section (P-1 through P-5) in its entirety and replace with the enclosed revised Proposal Section.

2. Detailed Estimate, Drawing 09-01 – Revise all pay items and quantities in the Detailed Estimate to match the enclosed revised Proposal Section. A summary of the changes is provided below.

1. Section VIII, Other Items – Added items 4 and 5 (167-1000 and 167-1500).
2. Add Section IX, Additional Items (If Necessary) – Item 206-0002.
3. Add Section X, Deductive Alternative – Item 797-0212.
