History

Originating in 1986, the National Community Development Week was created to bring national attention to the Community Development Block Grant(CDBG) Program through grassroots support at a time when the program was facing scrutiny by Congress. Grassroots support means activities by state and local CDBG grantees to recognize the program, showcase projects, and share program impact data with Congress. It provides the opportunity for communities to promote, educate, and advocate on behalf of the program.



Our Partners

Community Development Block Grant funds are allocated to agencies throughout the Macon-Bibb County Community following an application process. These funds are distributed to those agencies who partner with the Economic Community Development Department to offer programs in order to provide decent, safe and affordable housing, a suitable living environment, and economic opportunities for low and moderate income people. Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Heart of GA, Inc.

Big Brothers Big Sisters provides mentoring program services to at-risk youth of Bibb County. Youth will be matched with a mentor. Mentoring takes place by meeting one on one or in a virtual environment several hours each month until it is safe to meet in person. BBBS also provides enrichment activities in-person or virtually for adults and youth to participate in, including program supporting financial health, job search and career options, mental health, and educational support.

Crisis Line and Safe House of Central Georgia, Inc.

Crisis Line and Safe House provides shelter services to persons/families involved in a domestic violence situation with a 12-month period, along with comprehensive service. Low-income persons/families involved in domestic abuse enter this program through the 24-Hour crisis line. Eligible participants reside at the shelter or local site and participate in onsite case management. Services are administered within an undisclosed location for the safety of the domestic violence victims. Service are comprised of case management, advocacy, meals, clothing, transportation, therapy, linkage to resources for self-sufficiency, and other services needed to stabilize the client/family.

Family Advancement Ministries(FAM)

FAM provides car seats along with the training for installation and proper use for low-income families with young children in Macon-Bibb County. Program benefits low to moderate income families with young children by distributing children's car seats providing them with a safe environment while traveling enhancing compliance with GA Public Safety laws regarding car seat usage. This program addresses keeping children safe in cars and enabling parents to safely transport their children to daycare as they work, seek employment or attend school or training sessions.

Family Counseling Center of Central GA, Inc.(FCC) The Family Counseling Center CDBG program provides counseling and therapeutic programs and make referrals to other appropriate resources to help low-income families and neighborhoods deal with complex issues. The program of service addresses issues such as crime prevention, homeless services, creating suitable living environments, and creating economic opportunities and neighborhood organization through a referral "wrap-around" resource.

HomeFirst Housing Resource Services


HomeFirst Housing Resource Services



- HomeFirst provides homeownership counseling, foreclosure counseling, homebuyer education, linkage to mortgage products and the ability to strengthen personal finances. Services are designed to target low to moderate income residents within Macon-Bibb County and assist in teaching the necessary steps required to obtain and maintain a home.
- Agency provides quarterly Homebuyer Education Workshops, Public Service Announcements through various media outlets, distribute flyers through area partners, allow for one-on-one counseling steps, and provides information through various community activities and other housing programs.

Macon-Bibb County Economic Opportunity Council Dental Program

Macon-Bibb County Economic Opportunity Council provides dental services for homeless clients to include screenings, extractions, filings, cleanings, partials, and dentures. The objective is to assist homeless clients of Macon-Bibb County with good dental hygiene.







Macon-Bibb County Economic Opportunity Council Transportation Program



Macon-Bibb County Economic Opportunity Council provides a transportation program for the homeless community of Macon-Bibb County. Program is designed to assist homeless clients who lack resources for transportation for employment, medical and housing appointments. The Mentor's Project works with middle and high school students from grades 7-12. The Project provides the students with academic tools and life skills that are needed to complete high school, college, post-secondary schooling, Armed Forces and entering the world of work.

Each student is paired with a positive mentor from the community that provides support, counsel, friendship, and reinforcement.

Rebuilding Macon Minor Home Repair Program

Rebuilding Macon organizes and directs the efforts of 2000+ volunteers to repair the homes of low-income elderly and disabled homeowners in Macon-Bibb County. All eligible homes are inspected and a determination is made as to which repairs are needed on the home. A team with the needed skills is assembled to make the repairs.




Rebuilding Macon Volunteer Youth Program

Rebuilding Macon organizes and directs the volunteer efforts of high school and college students to repair homes of low-income elderly and disabled homeowners in Macon-Bibb County. Local high school students usually volunteer each fall and spring semester. College teams travel to Macon, GA in December and March for Alternative Community Services. In June and July, high school aged students attend summer camps in the area and assist in the program. All eligible homes are inspected and a determination is made as to which repairs are needed on the home. A team with the needed skills is assembled to make the repairs.
